

Choices in Education: Bend, Oregon

Choosing the right school for your child is an important decision for your family. Here is a guide to help you understand the school options offered in Bend, Oregon.

Public Schools

- ⊃ Traditional schools with educational standards set by
- > Funded and controlled by government at the local (school district), State (Oregon Department of Education), and Federal (U.S. Department of Education) levels
- ⇒ Available at no cost to all students who live within districts
- ⇒ Reliant on tax dollars and susceptible to funding cuts
- ⊃ Required to follow State teaching and evaluation guidelines
- Required to offer special education programs
- Generally larger class sizes
- No application or tuition fees

Private Schools

- ⊃ Private, not-for-profit schools that are financially and academically autonomous
- > Funded with tuition, grants, donations and endowments
- ⇒ Flexiblility with curriculum
- ⊃ Often parochial (associated with a religious organization but students do not have to be religious to attend)
- → Required religious education classes and prayer services
- ⊃ Generally smaller class sizes and academic rigor
- Application and acceptance required for admission
- → Tuition fees (financial support is generally available)

Independent Schools

- > Private, not-for-profit schools that are financially and academically autonomous
- > Funded with tuition payments, charitable contributions, and endowments (vs. taxes and church funds)
- > Flexiblility with curriculum
- Not bound to state test standards

- → Application and acceptance required for admission
- → Tuition fees (financial support is generally available)

Charter Schools

Public schools independently operated with support from a group of parents, teachers, community organizations, and for-profit companies



- → Must follow basic curricular requirements
- ⊃ Not governed by school boards or government authorities
- → All students who live within districts are eligible (lottery system) is required)
- ⊃ Some specialize in specific areas (technology, arts…etc) and/or target gifted or high-risk students
- Application and acceptance required for admission
- No tuition fees

Magnet / Focus Schools

- Public schools often with a special curricular focus (science, technology, arts, etc.)
- Funded with tax dollars; may also receive additional federal funding
- Governed by local school district
- Lottery application process
- No tuition fees

Home Schools

- Parents who chose to educate their children at home instead of sending them to a public, private or independent school have the option of home schooling
- Legal requirements for home schooling in the U.S. vary from place to place
- ⊃ In Central Oregon, students register for home school through the High Desert Education Service District
